Investments

The Fund is a “fund of funds,” meaning that it seeks to achieve its objective by investing in other Catholic Responsible Investments Funds mutual funds (the “Underlying Funds”) that represent a variety of asset classes and investment styles. The Fund’s asset allocation strategy emphasizes investments in equity securities (and certain other instruments described below) in an amount equal to 60% of its assets and exposure to fixed-income securities in an amount equal to 40% of its assets, with a bias towards “active” management in the equity portion of the portfolio.

Price/Book is a ratio used to compare a stock's market value to its book value.

Price/Earnings is the ratio for valuing a company that measures its current share price relative to its per-share earnings. P/E helps to determine the relative value of a company's shares in an apples-to-apples comparison.

Return on Equity measures financial performance calculated by dividing net income by shareholders' equity. ROE measures how effectively management is using a company's assets to create profits.

Sharpe Ratio is a measure that indicates the average return minus the risk-free return divided by the standard deviation of return on an investment.

Beta is a measure of the volatility, or systematic risk, of a security or a portfolio in comparison to the market as a whole. Beta is used in the capital asset pricing model (CAPM), a model that calculates the expected return of an asset based on its beta and expected market returns.

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Standard Deviation measures the dispersion of a set of data from its mean. The more spread apart the data, the higher the deviation. Standard deviation is calculated as the square root of variance. In finance, standard deviation is applied to the annual rate of return of an investment to measure the investment's volatility. Standard deviation is also known as historical volatility and is used by investors as a gauge for the amount of expected volatility.

Tracking Error shows a discrepancy between the price behavior of a position or a portfolio and the price behavior of a benchmark.

Effective Duration is a calculation for bonds with embedded options. Effective duration takes into account that expected cash flows will fluctuate as interest rates change.

Yield to Maturity is the rate of return anticipated on a bond if it is held until the maturity date. It is considered a long-term bond yield expressed as an annual rate.

Tracking Error shows a discrepancy between the price behavior of a position or a portfolio and the price behavior of a benchmark.

Credit quality: Ratings are sourced from a number of places, including S&P, Moodys, Bloomberg and individual sub-advisors. As ratings across providers differ slightly, we convert all ratings to the standard S&P ratings scale for reporting purposes.

The Fund's blended benchmark is 40% Bloomberg Aggregate / 45% Russell 3000 / 15% MSCI ACWI ex USA. Characteristics presented for the 60/40 Alpha Fund were also compiled using data from Bloomberg Capital U.S. 1-3 Year Treasury Bond Index. The Bloomberg Aggregate Bond Index is a broad-based fixed-income index. The index covers all major types of bonds, including taxable corporate bonds, Treasury bonds, and municipal bonds. The Russell 3000 Index is a capitalization-weighted stock market index that seeks to be a benchmark of the entire U.S. stock market. It measures the performance of the 3,000 largest publicly held companies incorporated in America as measured by total market capitalization, and represents approximately 98% of the American public equity market. The MSCI ACWI ex USA Index captures large- and mid-cap representation across 22 of 23 Developed Markets (DM) countries (excluding the U.S.) and 27 Emerging Markets (EM) countries. The index covers approximately 85% of the global equity opportunity set outside the U.S. The Bloomberg U.S. 1-3 Year Treasury Bond Index measures the performance of the US government bond market and includes public obligations of the U.S. Treasury with a maturity between 1 and up to (but not including) 3 years.

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
