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Year-to-Date Review

- Interest rate strategies were slightly negative due to the negative impact of a slightly longer duration as well as an overweight to the very short end of the curve.
- Sector allocation had the biggest positive impact due to overweights in corporate credit, especially in financials and industrials.
- Security selection was neutral.

Three-Month Review

- Interest rate strategies were slightly negative as the duration position had little impact on relative performance but its yield curve positioning detracted.
- Sector allocation was the main driver of outperformance as the allocation to corporate credit, particularly financials, accounted for much of the outperformance.
- Security selection was neutral.

Current Positioning

- The portfolio was neutral to the index.
- The portfolio continues to maintain its “barbelled” positioning relative to the benchmark.
- The Fund generates most of the excess return through sector and selection effects. The portfolio is meaningfully allocated to non-Treasury sectors.
